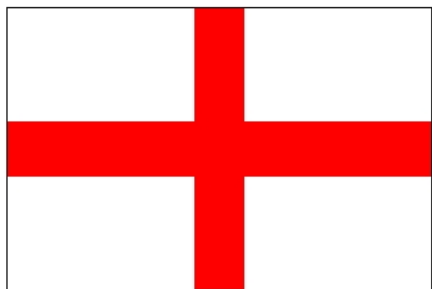

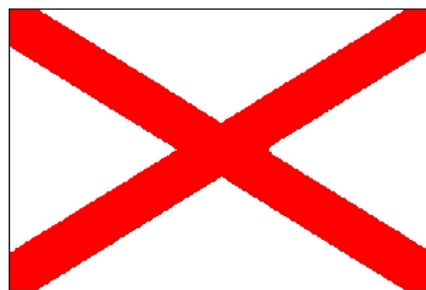

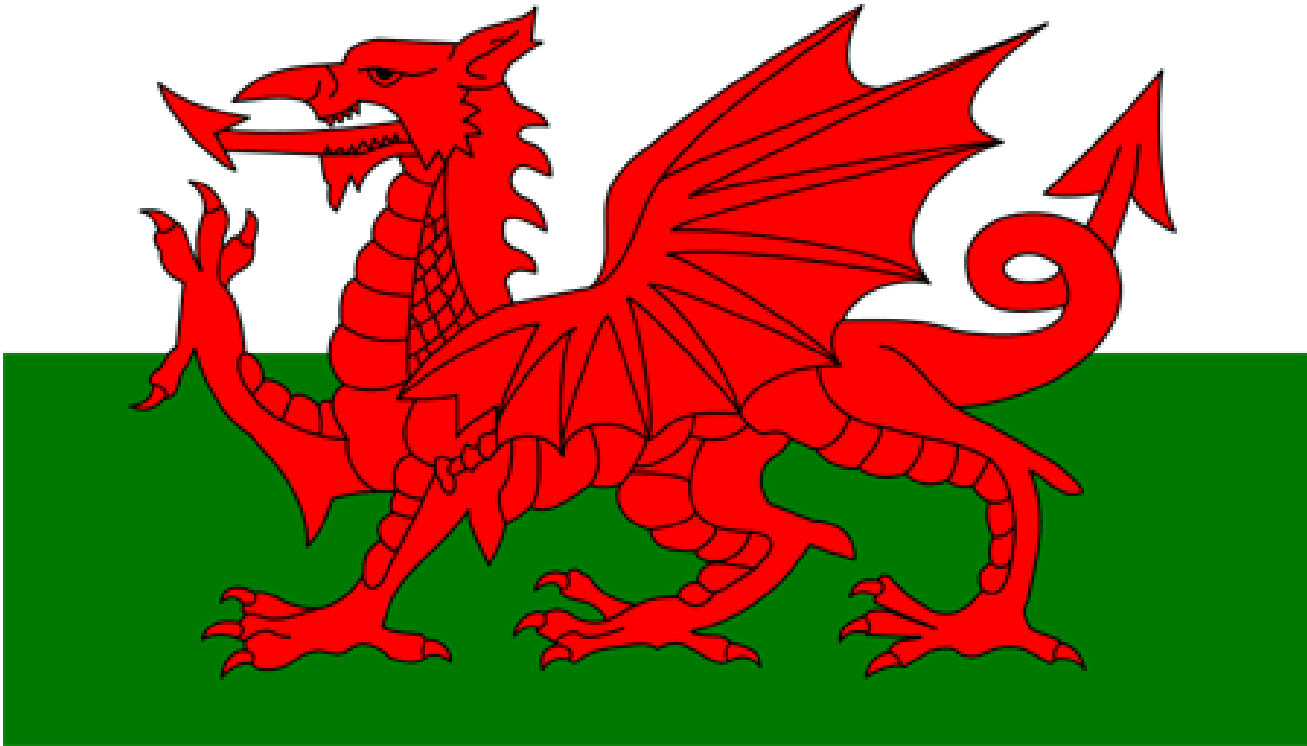

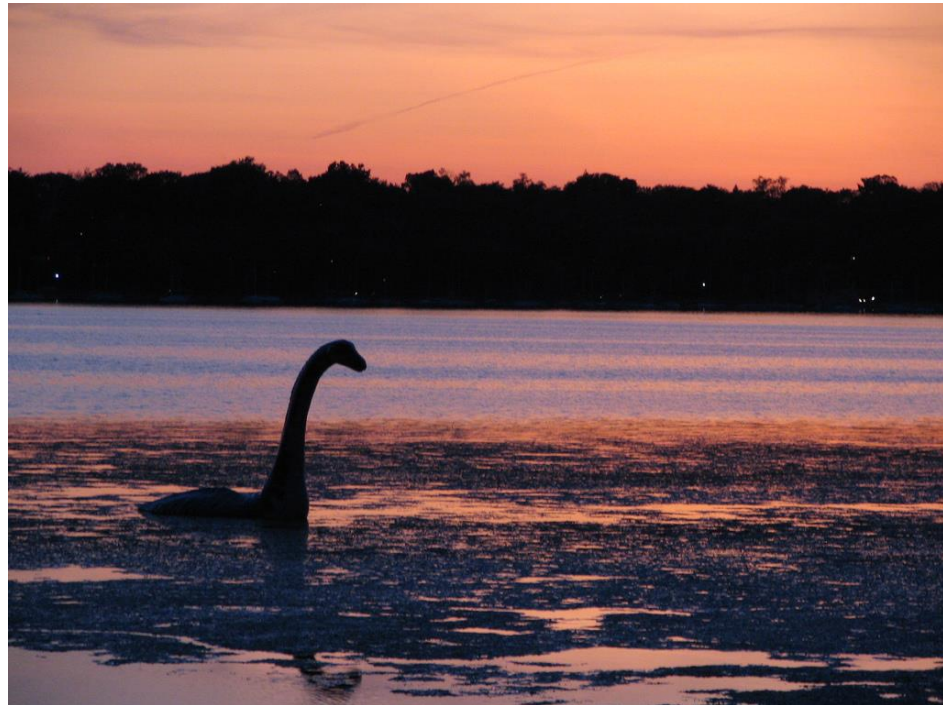




- Wales is believed to have more castles per square mile than anywhere else in the world.

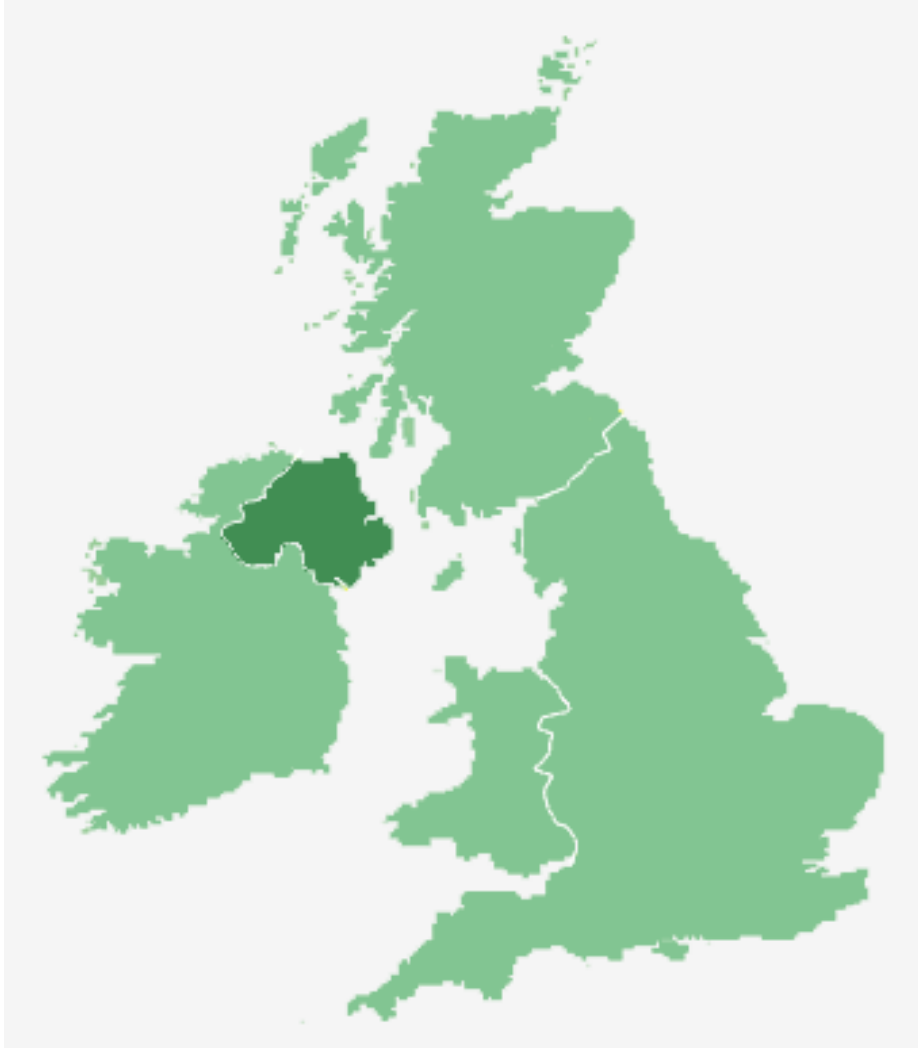

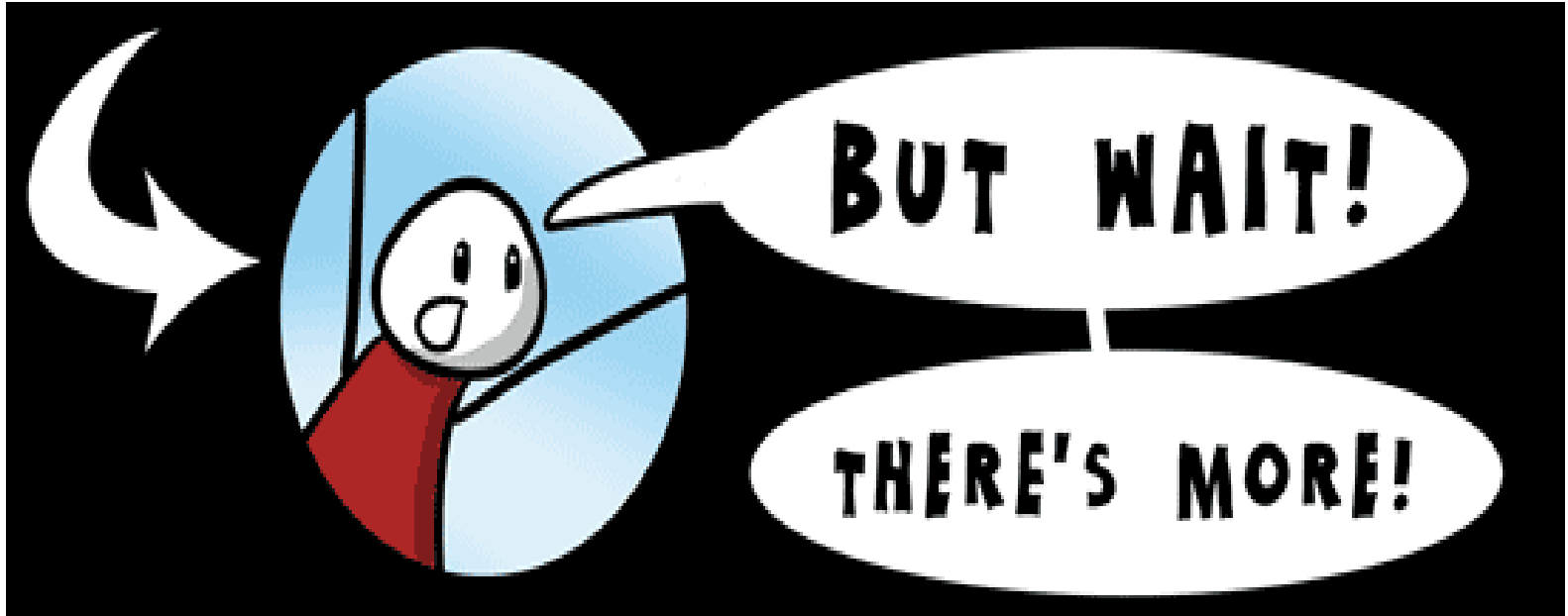
